

Please read through the current policy in place to keep everyone safe this summer. Please remember to bring your own tools, water, and food as access to Baldwin Hall is limited to use of the upstairs bathroom only. Camp must retain records of who is on the property and when so your assistance is appreciated.

Prior to your visit: Take your temperature and screen yourself for any apparent illness, including cough or respiratory distress. Confirm temperature is below 100 degrees Fahrenheit. Visitors who have a temperature greater than 100 degrees or show any signs of illness are not permitted on camp grounds. Prior to coming to camp, confirm with Jennifer Paragone that you have not experienced COVID-19 CDC-defined symptoms. If you have any 2 of the following symptoms please do not come to camp:

- Chills
- Repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell

Calculate your Risk: Estimate your risk exposure prior to coming to camp.

Low= minimal public exposure, working from home

Moderate= regular but limited public exposure, working from home

High= essential employee, regular public exposure

Upon entering: The gate will be closed when you enter. Please open it, drive through, and close it behind you. The gate needs to remain closed

at ALL times. Repeat the process when leaving: remember to close the gate.

Masks: You are required to bring your own mask. When in public and a six-foot distance is unavoidable, face coverings are required to be worn the proper way, covering your mouth and nose. Key paid staff will be on site, so it is important to wear masks.

Social Distancing: Appropriate social distancing strategies shall be implemented and are required. Group sizes should be no more than 10. 6 feet of space between individuals when possible.

Bathroom facilities: The only bathroom that will be open on site this summer is the one in Upper Baldwin Hall. There will be a tub of Clorox wipes. Please wipe any handles/surfaces you touch with a wipe and throw it in the garbage. We do not have staff scheduled to clean the bathroom, so it is important that you wipe down all you touch when in there for your safety and the safety of everyone else.

Reporting: Anyone who has been present on grounds that is diagnosed with COVID-19 or exposed within 14 days of their visit must notify Jennifer Paragone about the diagnosis/ exposure. Jennifer will need to notify the Connecticut Department of Public Health and notify others that were on site at the time that they have had potential exposure. If camp has any exposure the following procedures will be in place:

- ❑ Close off areas used by the person who is sick.
- ❑ Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the areas.
- ❑ Wait up to 24 hours or as long as possible before cleaning or disinfecting to allow respiratory droplets to settle before cleaning and disinfecting.

- ☒ Clean and disinfect all areas used by the person who is sick, such as offices, bathrooms, and common areas.
- ☒ If more than 7 days have passed since the person who is sick visited or used the facility, additional cleaning and disinfection is not necessary.
- ☒ Continue routine cleaning and disinfection.
