The Miniature Horse program has been offered at "Bring Your Horse to Camp Week" since 2018 and the campers have been coming ever since!

Focused on handling and driving components, campers learn to be better partners with their horses, while focusing on show practice, show prep, conditioning and skill building. Horses comfort and wellbeing are always top priority and positive reinforcement is the general training philosophy.

Horses of all abilities are welcome. Horse response and compliance are a key area of study. Showmanship, hunter, halter obstacle, and driving basics are all integral components of the week.

We focus on making our human handlers understand how minis' think and feel in each discipline. The basics of driving has a big lesson on making the campers feel what driving horses feel with bits and blinders.
